#### **Option One:**

Create a new book cover for the book with an insert that covers the 5 Elements of Literature: Characters, Setting, Plot:(Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action), Conflict, and Resolution.

#### Option 2:

Create a Comic strip that incorporates the 5 elements of Literature: Characters, Setting, Plot:(Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action), Conflict, and Resolution.

### Option 3:

Create a movie that reflects the telling of the key aspects of the story. You can do this with a digital camera (if one is available to you) or using a mobile phone video function.

#### Option 4:

Create an artistic representation of the story in the form of one of the following:

Sculpture or Painting

Be sure to incorporate details that reflect the elements of literature: Characters, Setting, Plot:(Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action), Conflict, and Resolution.
